

**Full-Time Faculty Position Opening (Music and Technology)
Department of Music, National Taiwan Normal University**

General Information:

The Music Department at the National Taiwan Normal University (NTNU) is seeking highly qualified applicants for an Assistant Professor (or above) of Music and Technology.

Bearing the hallmarks of tradition and innovation, NTNU has long been recognized as one of Taiwan's elite institutions of higher education. Founded in 1922, NTNU was formerly an institution dedicated to teacher training, as suggested in the name "Normal", that later evolved into a comprehensive university. Established on the credo that education is the root of our nation, NTNU has been committed to the pursuit of academic excellence, characterized by the many influential educators and researchers it has nurtured over the years.

NTNU's strong dedication in cultivating intelligent minds and transmitting knowledge with the highest level of standards, with the location of its main campus' in the cultural hub of Taipei City, attracts thousands of talented students, and devoted scholars from home and abroad every year. NTNU offers 62 academic subjects in its nine degree-granting colleges and a spectrum of courses in seven centers, providing scholarships and financial aid. Duties:

Principal duties include (1) Maintain a notable, visible professional career as artist/composer that indicates continuing growth and national/international visibility; (2) Teach undergraduate and graduate music and technology courses and related areas; (3) Direct undergraduate and graduate music and technology curricula, work closely with other programs in the music department, and mentor other undergraduate and graduate students as appropriate; (4) Fulfill other departmental needs as required.

The appointee will be expected to: demonstrate a strong commitment to teaching excellence, create an innovative curriculum for a broad range of students of varied identities and backgrounds who seek to explore a range of educational opportunities and career pathways; recruit and retain students of exceptional promise, and develop and maintain a visible national and international profile as a composer and a pedagogue. The appointee will also be expected to: teach courses in English, supervise graduate students' thesis, attend faculty meetings, and serve on faculty and university committees as appropriate.

Required Qualifications:

- 1) A terminal degree of PhD or DMA in Composition or Music-and-Technology-related diploma;
- 2) Strong competence in electronic and computer music composition, as well as interdisciplinary art work;
- 3) A strong profile as a composer and artist whose practices engage creatively with technology of software and hardware integration.

Preferred Qualifications:

- 1) Teaching experience in music technology, interdisciplinary art creation or avant-garde music production at the college level;
- 2) International competition award recipients;
- 3) Experiences of cross-nation collaboration

Required Documents:

1. Cover letter.
2. Curriculum vita.
3. An official copy of terminal or highest-degree diploma (Note: For overseas degrees, the doctoral degree diploma, academic transcripts, and proofs of related experiences should all be authenticated by the local R.O.C. Embassy, consulate or representative office in your region without which the application will not be considered by the department.)
4. An official copy of the teaching certificate issued by the Ministry of Education, Taiwan (optional)
5. Course curricula and syllabi, statement of teaching experience, or original copies of research projects.
6. Portfolio of creative activities in digital form which includes documentation of at least 2 pieces of representative practice with interdisciplinary approaches (dates valid between May 6, 2019 and May 5, 2022). Recordings are to be included.
7. Applicants applied as prize winners of international competitions are required to submit a minimum of three conducting concerts with no less than 60 minutes of music. Candidate selected by the department search committee will be asked to provide a scholarly writing (or thesis) for the interpretation of the repertoire from one of the above concerts.
8. A copy of doctoral dissertation or degree recital performance video performance is required for applicants with doctoral degrees received within two years and without a full-time teaching position at higher education institutions.
