Duties:

Teach undergraduate and graduate courses in composition and related areas; and fulfill other departmental needs as required. The appointee will also be expected to supervise graduate students' thesis, attend faculty meetings, and serve on faculty and university committees as appropriate.

Required Qualifications (with proofs):

- 1. Doctoral degree in composition, or equivalent diploma.
- 2. Teaching experience in music theory or composition at the college level.

Application Materials and Deadline:

- 1. Cover letter.
- 2. Curriculum vitae.

- 3. An official copy of terminal or highest degree diploma (Note: For overseas degrees, the doctoral degree diploma, academic transcripts, and proofs of related experiences should all be authenticated by the local R.O.C. Embassy, consulate or representative office in your region without which the application will not be considered by the department.) The authenticated copy should be submitted no later than the campus interview.
- 4. Course curricula and syllabi, statement of teaching experience, or research projects.
- 5. A portfolio with a minimum of three public performances, must include sheet music scores, copies of concert programs, and YouTube links of live performances. Concert dates are only valid between January 16, 2018 and January 15, 2023. A scholarly writing (or thesis) is also required for the interpretation of one of the above performances. Performances must include 1. orchestral music, 2. chamber music, 3. vocal music, or 4. others, with works from no more than 5 genres. The total length of the submitted works needs to be at least 70 minutes for an assistant professor, 80 minutes for an associated professor, and 90 minutes for a professor.
- 6. Applicants applied as prize winners of international competitions are required to submit a scholarly writing (or thesis) for the interpretation of one composition or performance from works included in the portfolio.
- 7. For applicants with doctoral degrees received within two years and without a fulltime teaching position at higher education institutions, a copy of doctoral dissertation and degree recital performance video links are required.
